

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER GETTING THE VACCINE?

I've had both my vaccine shots. Now what? Do I need to wear a mask and avoid close contact with others if I have had two shots? **YES**. Not enough information is currently available to say if or when the CDC will stop recommending that people wear masks and avoid close contact with others to help prevent the spread of the virus that causes COVID-19.

Experts need to understand more about the protection that COVID-19 vaccines provide in real-world conditions before making that decision. Other factors, including how many people get vaccinated and how the virus is spreading in communities, will also affect this decision. We also don't yet know whether getting a COVID-19 vaccine will prevent you from spreading the virus that causes COVID-19 to other people, even if you don't get sick yourself. CDC will continue to update this information as we learn more.

While experts learn more about the protection that COVID-19 vaccines provide under real-life conditions, it will be important for everyone to continue using all the tools available to help stop this pandemic.

To protect yourself and others, follow these recommendations:

- Wear a mask over your nose and mouth
- Stay at least 6 feet away from others
- Avoid crowds
- Avoid poorly ventilated spaces
- Wash your hands often

Together, COVID-19 vaccination and following the CDC's recommendations for how to protect yourself and others will offer the best protection from getting and spreading COVID-19.

We're all looking forward to the day when we can start resuming "normal" life again. We still need to be diligent and continue to follow CDC protocol. Please continue to do your part pulling together to help stop the spread and keep everyone as safe as possible.

HELENA HIGH SCHOOL HISTORY

THE SECOND HELENA HIGH SCHOOL 1935-1955 1025 N. Rodney

In 1934, construction began on the new Helena High School, funded with Federal monies under the auspices of the Public Works Administration (PWA), part of the Roosevelt administration's "New Deal" of 1933. The building required permanent closures of portions of Davis, Hoback, Billings, Livingston and Sixteenth Streets. Completed in 1935, the school was dedicated on September 21, 1935.

Less than a month after its dedication in 1935, the new high school was severely damaged by a 6.2 magnitude earthquake on October 18th, followed by a 6.0 magnitude aftershock on October 31st. According to post-quake estimates, approximately 75% of the new high school was damaged. It took nearly two years to repair the structure, during which time classes were held in railroad passenger coaches. The building remained in use as Helena High School until 1955, when Helena High School moved to its current location on Montana Avenue. At that time, the facility opened as Helena Junior High School, and has since been renamed, Helena Middle School.

HIGH SCHOOL ON WHEELS 1935-1937 Railway Coaches on E. Lyndale Avenue

A few weeks after the October 1935 earthquakes nearly destroyed the new Helena High School on Rodney Street, a section of East Lyndale Avenue, two blocks north of the High School, was closed, and tracks were laid there to accommodate coaches donated by both the Great Northern and Northern Pacific railway companies for use as class-rooms. They were in use from December 1935 to June 1937.

ROCKY VACCINE REGISTRATION

There comes a time when we face challenges of massive proportions, and we hope and pray we will be adequate when it is our turn to respond. Getting the COVID vaccine out to older Montanans is our current trial. Rocky stepped up. Here is how.

Lewis and Clark County Health offers an online registration system for COVID vaccinations. There are more people to vaccinate than there is vaccine, and the County needed a way to distribute the vaccinations fairly and quickly. Problem is, many older adults cannot use technology well for a whole variety of reasons including poverty, skill, and experience with technology. The County asked Rocky to assist people with registering for the vaccine. By the time this article is published, Rocky will assist over 1,000 Lewis and Clark County residents age 70 and older. The number served will continue to grow because we intend to continue providing the assistance for everyone 60 years old and older. Doing so is part of our mission. It is also the right thing to do.

We are lucky. We get the opportunity to serve a very sizable number of older adults during the worst pandemic in 100 years. Here we are, providing very necessary and substantial services in a time of great need. While our other work is equally important, now is the time to step up and do the best we can with the resources we have.

At times, Rocky receptionists who answer our main telephone number, (406)447-1680, field as many as 100 calls per hour. Each week, the online registration for the vaccines begins at 9:00 AM on Fridays. The receptionists take the names and phone numbers of about 200 people, and they pass them to Area IV employees and volunteers. These Area IV staff members then call each person to assist with the online registration. Individuals and couples receive appointments for their first and second vaccinations

along with the instructions on where to show up, how to dress, and other relevant details.

Yes, the work is disruptive to routine. So is a pandemic. Yes, we all must juggle multiple priorities. Just because we face a nasty virus doesn't mean everything else takes a holiday. Yes, each of us has more work to do than we can complete. No rest for the weary, as they say. And, yes, we have to make choices. At this moment, there is nothing more important than getting older adults access to COVID vaccinations. Nothing.

I also want to call your attention to the teamwork involved. It's not just Rocky. We are partnering with Lewis and Clark County, Pureview, and St. Peters Hospital. It takes a whole village to vaccinate so many. It's huge, and it's difficult. Yet, the sum of all these parts is far greater than the whole. Our engagement is real work for real people and critical services in a time of crisis. Please keep the faith and we will get through these novel times exhausted and happy.







AREA IV HAS FREE LIFELIKE ROBOTIC PETS AND BRAIN STIMULATION TOOLS

Through funding from the CARES act and Blue Cross Blue Shield, the Area IV Agency on Aging of Rocky Mountain Development Council, Inc. has free, lifelike robotic pets and brain stimulation tools available to relieve symptoms of loneliness and social isolation caused by the Covid-19 pandemic.

National studies have shown the companionship of robotic pets can provide comfort, especially to individuals affected by dementia, Alzheimer's, and other cognitive disorders. Robotic pets and brain stimulation tools are available for free to qualified recipients age 60 and over in Broadwater, Jefferson, Gallatin, Lewis & Clark, Meagher, and Park counties upon completion of a simple application.

HEALTH AND WELLNESS CLASSES

Area IV Agency on Aging of Rocky will begin offering virtual evidence-based health and wellness classes in the near future. Rigorous studies have been done that consistently show positive changes for participants. Besides the health benefits, these classes will offer a chance to interact with others in the comfort and safety of your own home. To help us gauge the level of interest in these classes, please indicate which classes you would register to attend.

Powerful Tools for Caregivers: This class is designed to help caregivers take better care of themselves while caring for a friend or relative. The class helps caregivers improve their self-care behaviors and emotion management, increase their self-confidence, and utilize more community resources. (1.5 hours, one day a week for six weeks)

Stepping On: This is a fall prevention class. You'll learn how to build and maintain the physical strength and balance you need to walk confidently and receive information about what increases risk of falling while learning strategies to prevent future falls. (2 hours, one day a week, for seven weeks)

Montana Living Life Well: This is a class for individuals with a chronic health condition or individuals caring for someone with a chronic health condition. The class is designed to help you gain confidence in your ability to control your symptoms. (2.5 hours, one day a week, for six weeks)

Thursday, March 25 8:00 am - 10:30 am The Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) is a program where seniors can receive regular allocations of free food every other month. The program guidelines mandate that the person receiving the food must be 60 years of age or older, a resident of Montana, and meet an income requirement. Food typically consists of canned fruit, vegetables, meats, juice, cereals, dry milk, shelf stable milk, cheese, pasta or beans, and peanut butter.

Rocky will have supplemental foods available for Helena-area senior citizens at the Helena Food Share, 1616 Lewis Street, Helena, MT. We are lucky to work with Helena Food Share to make the program more accessible to those individuals picking up the food. There is no charge for the food.

Persons 60+ will be certified to receive the food based on income and residency eligibility. For further information or questions, call Rocky at 406-447-1680.

LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Something strange is going on in the world. People are lining up to get shots! Who would have ever thought there would be such high demand for having a big, nasty needle stuck into your arm?

The last several weeks have presented an opportunity for Rocky to be on the front lines of the pandemic through helping seniors with vaccine registration. The County contacted Jim Marks, Rocky's Area IV Agency on Aging Program Director, to ask for assistance for people age 70 and over who do not have the technology available to register themselves.

It started with the Independent Record and the local TV news station advertising the service the day before. While we were all very excited for the recognition, we were unprepared for the onslaught of calls that began

immediately. You may have heard that the number of vaccines available in the first couple days of registration "sold out" in the online system in three minutes! By the second week of registration we had put together a better system to handle a greater volume of calls and have been able to register those interested much more effeciently.

The main theme that has come through loud and clear is that people are desperate to get the vaccine in hopes of putting the pandemic behind us. We are thrilled to be a part of the community-wide effort get everyone access to the vaccine as soon as possible. Stay safe as we move towards spring!


