AN EAGLE MANOR SPOTLIGHT: JANECE HONKA IS HOME AT LAST

There are certain people who carry a positivity that grips you and remains with you afterward. Janece Honka, who prefers Jani, is one of those people. The reason for her newfound optimism is one which many of us take for granted. Jani has found a home. Her one-bedroom apartment at Rocky's affordable housing in Eagle Manor II is a clean, safe, and spacious place to live. It has become a place where she feels connected to a community of friends. "It was finding a home at last," said Jani.

The road to finding her current home was not an easy one. Jani, a Helena native, spent two decades on the move with her family. There were many stops in several different states along the way. Jani returned to Helena in 2000 and began renting an apartment in the historic west side. The apartment would be her

living space for the next 22 years. Most of the two decades that Jani rented the apartment were okay. However, the situation began to deteriorate. According to Jani, "The apartment was falling apart." She made numerous calls for repairs, but they continually went unanswered. Jani's sight impairment added to the strain of an already challenging situation. Soon her living situation was untenable. Jani began searching for a new apartment in 2020, but with a skyrocketing rental market, Jani was stuck, so much so that the thought of homelessness became a concern. Her options appeared bleak, but she remained hopeful. Jani had friends at the time who were familiar with affordable housing units and encour-"Jani" continued p. 2

aged Jani to reach out to Rocky for help. Jani's mother worked for Rocky Mountain Development Council in the 1980s, giving her a comfort level with the organization, that made it easier to reach out.

Jani took the first step in June of 2022, by filling out a rental application to Eagle Manor. After three months of waiting and paperwork, Jani secured her apartment on August 2. Eagle Manor Assistant Manager Colleen Phillips said the timing for her application worked out great.

The housing situation for seniors and individuals with disabilities is nothing short of a crisis, and waiting lists are the norm when applying for housing. Despite waiting lists, Phillips mentioned the importance of applying regardless. "There is no way of knowing when an apartment may become available, and you want to be ready."

Jani finished our time together by allowing me to take her picture inside her apartment. The living room and kitchen are well-decorated. Photos of family members and loved ones are out for display. Her 17-year-old cat Bailey was sleeping in her bedroom behind a closed door. Jani maintains a house rule that a cat of that age can sleep in whatever bed they choose. It was a humbling experience being in the apartment and sensing that this was not just a living space; this was the center of Jani's life, her home. When I asked Jani how long she planned on staying, she replied with a smile, "At least until I am 100."



MEMBER SPOTLIGHT: VICTOR SAMPLE

Victor Sample was born to Victor and Beverly Sample on March 21, 1952, in Butte, Montana. Not long after, he was graced with three sisters and a couple of brothers, none of whom currently live in Montana.





two-room school in Radersburg, and later taught in Toston, in a three-room school. Victor graduated from high school in Townsend and went on to the University of Washington in Seattle. He graduated in 1975 with a bachelor's degree in Mathematics. About six months before graduating, he discovered the field of computer programming. Not surprisingly, he soaked up a plethora of knowledge before moving on to Montana Power, where he was a computer programmer for their gas and electrical engineers.

After a stint there, he accepted a job in Dallas, Texas, where a good friend resided.

In 1983, Vic accepted a job with TSI International (one of the oldest software companies in the US) and worked for 10 years as a programmer/manager for them.

He moved back to Helena and worked remotely for some time. He was likely one of the first to work remotely. He was a software developer and director of product development.

One of Victor's sisters married a fellow who had a sister named Pam. One summer evening, Pam came to the Mint Bar in Townsend and asked if Vic Sample was there. He responded, "Depends – who's asking?" And so it goes, they seemed to hit it off. In 1992, they got married. Pam became not only Victor's wife but his sister's sister-in-law (for the second time) and his brother-in-law's sister-in-law.

My grandma and grandpa and their sisters and brothers played that same matching game back in their day.

Pam worked for the telephone company then known as Mountain Bell, then later as US West, and most recently Century Link for around 15 years. She also worked as an administrative assistant for several companies in Michigan and Florida.

Victor and Pam moved to Detroit, where he worked for a large computer company, and designed software for products used by other computer professionals. The company also owned two professional hockey teams: one was a small local team, and the other was the NHL Hartford Whalers/Carolina Hurricanes. The company was locally known primarily for the hockey teams, even though they were a highly regarded computer software company in the United States and abroad.

Victor accepted a job back with TSI in Boca Raton, Florida (home of the original IBM PC). In the eight years they were there Victor worked for three different companies – managing the same development group working on the same software products. TSI (which changed its corporate name to Mercator) was acquired by a Boston-based software company named Ascential Software, which was then acquired by IBM.

After retiring, they moved to the northwest mountains of North Carolina and stayed for six years. Their home bordered the state of Tennessee.

When giving directions to their house, they used to say, "When you see the Welcome to Tennessee sign, turn!" After six years there, they moved back to Townsend. Several members of Victor's family were experiencing health problems and they wanted to be closer to Victor and Pam's families. Ironically, many members of their families subsequently moved to Iowa and Texas. They have a son living in Texas who has been a freelance Chef for 20 years. He has blessed Victor and Pam with a granddaughter and grandson.

Pam is an artist and owns an art gallery in Townsend. She has hosted several "sip and paint" events where attendees enjoy a social outing and create a painting from her illustrations. Victor enjoys woodworking and has a full range of tools, from saws to planners, sanders, and routers. His creations range from picture frames for Pam's artwork to cabinets, drafting tables, and other furniture. They are all housed in their big workshop. He also has dabbled in some stainedglass projects. Pam obtained antique windows from a historic house in Townsend when it was renovated, and from a historic barn in Clyde Park. She has created artwork for local businesses and art lovers using antique windows.

A few of the activities Victor and Pam are involved in include the Townsend Fall Fest and numerous local and regional boards.

A small group, including Victor, created a local community called MT43 News, covering local events and issues. Victor acts as the managing editor.

Victor is the President of the Broadwater County Hospital District. He's also Secretary of Southwest Montana, a 9-county regional tourism organization that receives bed-tax money to promote tourism in southwest Montana. He is on numerous boards and committees ranging from the Senior Advisory Council to the County Museum Board. He also assists with a countywide yard sale in the summer, for which he provides printed and digital maps. He writes a column in MT43 News called "Tech Talk"

The program guidelines mandate that the person receiving the food must be 60 years of age or older, a resident of Montana, and meet an income requirement. Food typically consists of canned fruit, vegetables, meats, juice, cereals, dry milk, shelf stable milk, cheese, pasta or beans, and peanut butter.

Rocky will have supplemental foods available for Helena-area senior citizens at the Helena Food Share, 1616 Lewis Street, Helena, MT. We are lucky to work with Helena Food Share to make the program more accessible to those individuals picking up the food. There is no charge for the food.

Persons 60+ will be certified to receive the food based on income and residency eligibility. For further information or questions, call Rocky at 406-447-1680.
