NEW HOME MODIFICATION PROGRAM FROM ROCKY'S AGENCY ON AGING

Finding and keeping affordable housing sure is tough these days. For older adults on fixed and relatively low incomes, keeping a roof over one's head presents gut-wrenching challenges. The difference between housed and unhoused is a terribly thin line for far too many older adults. When one visits homeless shelters, most feel astonished by the number of unhoused older adults living in the shelters. There are so many older adults in homeless shelters, the shelters struggle with how to accommodate residents with age-related characteristics. No single solution will improve the situation, but many modest solutions might grant relief.

Rocky Aging delivers its services

guided and informed by values. Perhaps our greatest value of all is to assist older adults to age in place in their own homes and communities. It's no joke when older adults face potential homelessness due to low vacancy rates, long wait lists, rising property taxes, and high prices. The emerging housing crisis for older adults is why Rocky Aging is about to launch a new program. As part of our strategic plan, Rocky Aging offers a very modest benefit to be used to modify or repair homes. The Older Americans Act allows Area Agencies on Aging to provide up to \$750 per project for things like improving accessibility with grab bars and ramps, standard home maintenance, and critical services such as cleaning chimneys and furnaces. The law limits the benefit to no more than \$1,500 in a lifetime. It isn't much, but every little bit helps. Moreover, Rocky Aging partners with others to leverage more benefits for individuals. In other words, we combine our direct benefits with benefits from other human service providers. Partnerships secure the greatest positive outcomes, and such collective efforts are the bread and butter of Older Americans Act services.

MEMBER SPOTLIGHT: LOWELL WASCHER

LOWELL WASCHER was born in West Point, Nebraska, on April 22, 1941. West Point is on a bend along a river that they then called New Philadelphia. It was founded in the spring of 1857 when Omaha Businessmen formed the Nebraska Settlement Association to find suitable townsites in the Elkhorn Valley. The town underwent a name change to West Point because it was the westernmost outpost along the valley.

Lowell had three sisters: an older sister named Lois, and two younger sisters named LeAnn and Lanna. Lowell's mother and father farmed about 160 acres of row corn, soybeans, and raised cattle, and hogs. Lowell started his education in a one-room schoolhouse in Wisner, Nebraska, and tried hard to develop a love for learning. He said he was not the best student. They stayed there for nine years and then moved to Minnesota to pick up farming. Lowell attended school just down the road in Odin and studied agriculture. He graduated from St. James in 1958, just a short way from Odin. He said his higher education was in the School of Hard Knocks.

In 1959, he joined the National Guard and chose the artillery section to learn to shoot. When he finished in 1963, he returned to Odin to help his folks work their farm. He was married later and had two boys, Lance, and Justin, along with a stepson, Troy. In 1985, he married his second wife, Lois. She was from Iowa, and it was a side joke that she would need a green card to get into Minnesota. Lois was a teacher and worked with children with disabilities. Lowell bought and farmed 180 acres of his own and raised a few feeder cattle and hogs until 1993.

Lowell spent three years in Gillette, Wyoming, as a job shop machinist, and at the same time, he worked part-time in a machine job shop learning the ins and outs of being a machinist. They built and repaired coal industry equipment. The job forced Lowell into learning some of the finer art of mathematics. He turned a shaft on a lathe that was 26,000 pounds and used to power a 30-foot coal-crushing wheel. They moved to Lakeville, Minnesota, doing the same work for another nine years. All the while, they longed to be in Montana and kept looking for work there. Lois was already retired when Summit Aerospace moved them to Helena, Montana, in 2004. Lowell worked for the Midwest Coaches of Bismarck, North Dakota, and drove as a carrier, hauling everything from nuclear medicine to sample drugs for pharmaceutical salesmen. Lois struggled with dementia for several years and passed away in 2021.

Lowell has four grandchildren and six great-grandchildren, all of whom live out of state. He only

sees them a couple of times a year. He has made a couple of tours, one to Kentucky through horse country and one up the Snake River on a jet boat.

Lowell started driving the bus for Rocky Mountain Development Council Inc. in 2011. Lowell drove the bus until 2016 before retiring. Lowell says he is not much for hunting or fishing but loves to put puzzles together. He has been whittling, and wood carving for over 10 years. Lowell spends some of his free time carving creations out of all types of wood. He comes to the Senior Center every Thursday afternoon and joins the members of the Wood Carving Club. They create some amazing figures and artwork. The club has a sale every year of some of its finest creations.

The program guidelines mandate that the person receiving the food must be 60 years of age or older, a resident of Montana, and meet an income requirement. Food typically consists of canned fruit, vegetables, meats, juice, cereals, dry milk, shelf stable milk, cheese, pasta or beans, and peanut butter.

Rocky will have supplemental foods

available for Helena-area senior citizens at the Helena Food Share, 1616 Lewis Street, Helena, MT. We are lucky to work with Helena Food Share to make the program more accessible to those individuals picking up the food. There is no charge for the food.

We have a great roasted tomato soup recipe for you that has a balanced sweet flavor that is perfect for the springtime weather. This recipe calls for fresh tomatoes but those can be hard to find at times this time of year in Montana so feel free to use canned tomatoes instead. If so, try San Marzano tomatoes which are known for their fresh sweet flavor

Ingredients:

1lb of fresh tomatoes ½ medium diced onion 1 red bell pepper diced 3 tbsp olive oil ¼ C fresh chopped basil 3 cloves chopped garlic ½ C heavy cream ½ fresh squeezed lemon juice 4 C chicken broth



Cooking Instructions

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. On a large baking sheet roast the onion, garlic, tomatoes, and peppers. Roast vegetables for 25 minutes until vegetables are soft. Bring stock to a boil and add in the roasted vegetables. Blend the mixture with a hand blender adding in the cream, fresh basil, and lemon juice. Season with salt and pepper to taste and enjoy!

EARLY SPRING SAFETY!

While the first official day of spring this year falls on March 20, that doesn change much for us weath-



er-wise here in Montana. The chance for a downfall of fresh snow is never out of the question. When you combine the snow with warmer spring temperatures and sunlight during the day, the potential for early morning and evening ice increases. This makes slips and falls much more likely.

For seniors 65 and over, falling becomes increasingly dangerous. In fact, falls affect one in four seniors, with a quarter of those ending in broken bones and head injuries. Stay vigilant around your homes using ice-melt salts and shoveling off fresh snow to prevent ice build-up. Shoe attachments such as Yak-Traks are a great option to help gain traction and avoid slipping.

At Rocky, we use many precautions around the Neighborhood Center to prevent slips and falls. This includes snow plowing the parking lot and sidewalks, ice melt and sand disbursement, and monitoring the ever-changing weather conditions. Even with all these precautions, the potential for falls is always there.

The Neighborhood Center gets heavy traffic changing the surface condition of our parking lots and sidewalks. We urge you to take your time and exercise caution when exiting your vehicles in the parking lot and on the sidewalks as you enter the building.

Remember that for those within Helena city limits Rocky offers a shuttle service from your home to the Neighborhood Center. If you feel the conditions may impair driving, we encourage you to save the headache and use the shuttle service. We look forward to seeing you all this March and April. Be safe and take care!
